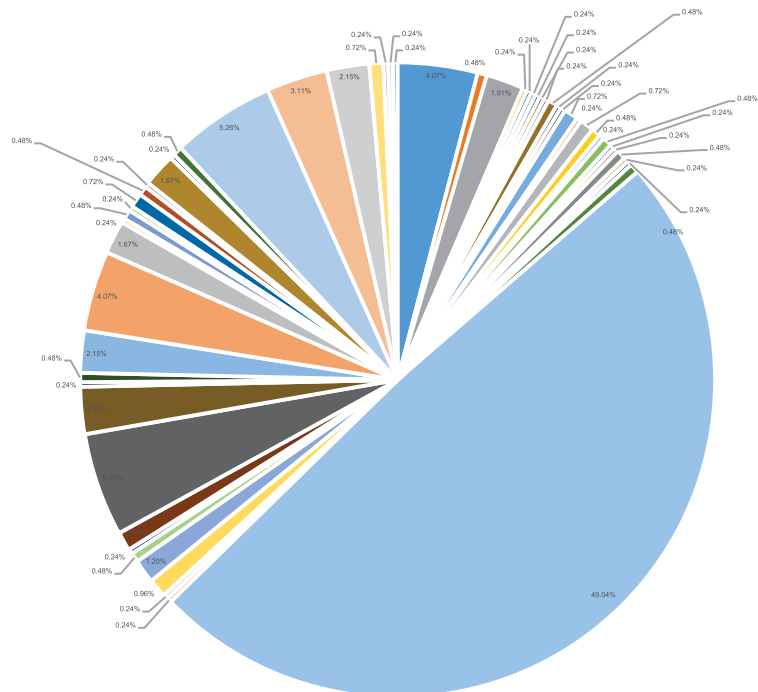

Del Rio High School Class of 2015 Salutatorian Marco Fuentes

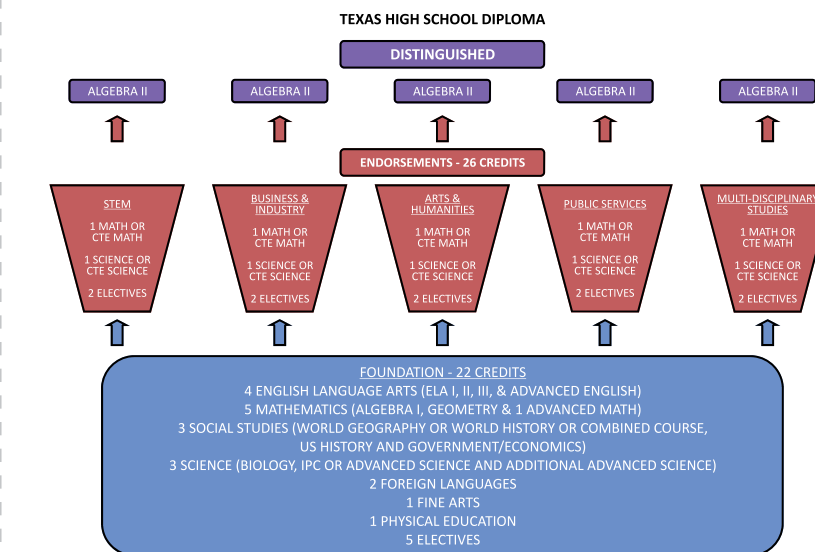
